TRAVEL TIPP

Frauenfeld is located in the Canton Thurgau which offers a treasure of precious little towns and numerous castles (www.thurgau-bodensee.ch) and a long stretch of shore along fabulous Lake Constance. Many castles can be visited; some even offer hotels/restaurants. The Lake Constance Region has extraordinarily rich cultural offerings. We also recommend a Sunday trip to either Konstanz/Island Reichenau or St. Gallen.

The **city of Konstanz**, Germany, offers a fully preserved, historical city center where world history was once took place: During the Council of Konstanz when three popes simultaneously claimed the throne of Peter, a divided Christianity, and conflict throughout Europe caused turmoil, spiritual and secular dignitaries came together to settle the issues in dialogue between 1414 and 1418. This approach has paid off: the discussion across borders still forms the foundation of the European idea, and especially the region.

The nearby **island of Reichenau**, Germany, was once an epicenter of culture and theological scripture/book production in medieval times. In 2003, it was included in the list of UNESCO World Heritage Sites. The so-called Monastery Island Reichenau celebrates the 1300-year jubilee in 2024 and to this date, you can visit three architectonically important medieval church buildings and see prime examples of local Carolingian and Ottonian artwork in the island's and Konstanz's museums.

St. Gallen has a similarly rich history: in 719 the famous Monastery St. Gallen was founded on the site of an even older hermitage. The growing settlement became a center of pilgrimage and trade, reached the status of an imperial city by 1180 and joined the Swiss Confederation as a full member in 1454. Already in the 15th century St. Gallen developed into an epicenter of high quality textile production. The town offers a beautiful historic city center and the abbey precinct has been included in the list of UNESCO World Heritage Sites in 1983. On the way to St. Gallen you can visit the Würth Haus in Rorschach, a lakeside well-curated private art collection.

HISTORY OF THE CANTONAL HOSPITAL THURGAU

1823 to 1896: Sickroom in the carpenter's workshop

On April 15, 1823, 24 respectable craftsmen, masters and journeymen founded a savings fund „here in the town of Frauenfeld“. The journeymen paid „three kreuzer after the end of each week“ into a drawer with two locks; the chairman, the other by an old journeyman, kept one key. In 1824, the town council took note of this fund with favor and decided to set up a sickroom in the carpenter's workshop building. In 1825, the masters rented the „unsightly room“ for their journeymen, which they „properly repaired“ six years later.

In 1844: The master craftsmen built a new building in the Ergarten, for which the town generously supplied timber for 150 guilders. Three rooms with six beds were available for sick journeymen. Sick people over 55 years of age, patients with the „lust epidemic“ and those who had brought their illness on themselves through a dissolute lifestyle were excluded from admission. In 1844, bricklayers, carpenters and plasterers joined the Master's House. In 1854, the Board of Directors of the municipality rented a lower room for the female servants for an annual rent of 25 francs. From 1846 to 1896, 2,548 patients were accommodated and cared for in the journeymen's hospital for 26,991 days. With the opening of the general hospital in 1897, the old journeymen's hospital became redundant and was converted into an asylum for the elderly.

1897 to 1974: As January 1, 1897 fell on a Friday, the hospital opened with 36 beds in the main building and 12 in the segregation building on Monday, January 4. The staff consisted of a hospital doctor and his deputy – both part-time, the house parents, a porter and four maids. The Neumünster in Zurich sent two deacons as „waiting staff“ on January 2, followed by three more within two months. Extensions followed in 1914 and 1929, which alleviated the lack of space somewhat. The 1929 building was the last until the hospital was demolished 45 years later. The shortage of space continued as patient numbers rose and became increasingly acute. After countless „planning games“, the people said yes to a new hospital in Huben in May 1963. In the summer of 1967, the excavators drove up and the excavation for the new hospital began.

On October 29, 1974, the time came for the move. Soldiers from the Lausanne Medical Transport Recruit School carefully and almost shyly pulled 80 patients and 15 babies into the new hospital in their field-grey ambulances.
